DAY

1

DELHI ARRIVAL

Welcome to Delhi, a monumental city with a vibrant mix of old and new teeming bazaars, stately British boulevards, powerful Mughal palaces and forts, and intricate, ethereal towers, temples and tombs. You will be warmly greeted on arrival at the international airport by our local staff, and swiftly escorted by private vehicle to our luxury hotel. Since many flights arrive late in the day, it will be off to bed, with the first of many exciting days ahead of us in the morning.

DAY

2

DELHI

Our introduction to India begins in the hustle and bustle of Old Delhi, the Mughal capital established by Shah Jahan in 1638. Enjoy a cycle rickshaw ride through the narrow lanes of Chandni Chowk, the spine of Old Delhi that houses the spice market and jeweler's lane. The famous Red Fort, a marvel in red sandstone, is where Jawaharlal Nehru unfurled the flag of newly-independent India on August 15, 1947. Across the way is the Jama Masjid, the largest mosque in India where 20,000 people can pray at one time.

Our tour of Old Delhi will tantalize us with delights such as the Parathewali Gali -a whole street lined with shops specializing only in Parathas, a special flat bread which is stuffed with all kinds of vegetables, cheeses, spices and everything else the chefs fancy! Watch them create master pieces using exotic flours, spices, vegetables and other ingredients. These simple melt-in-your-mouth delicacies will leave you craving for more long after you return home. We continue our quest, still in Old Delhi and on to the famous bazaar - Chandni Chowk- bustling with commerce and enterprise. Spices are the specialty of Khari Baoli, be prepared to be assaulted by exotic smalls and fragrances.

OPTIONAL: This afternoon enjoy your lunch at Karim's - all the secrets of the Moghul Emperors Royal kitchens have been passed on from one generation to another and form the basis of Moghul Cuisine. Here in this area of Old Delhi you will sample the most delicate kababs cooked to perfection in tandoors and served with Roomali Rotis-a melt in your mouth "handkerchief" bread. Watch the masters prepare this unique "bread" that takes the shape of a handkerchief and can measure up to 3'x3'! USD 50 per person

Later in the day, we will regroup to meet a successful woman entrepreneur for Chai and Chat! While sharing an essential cup of Indian tea, we will enjoy the opportunity to talk about life in India

DAY

3

DELHI - AGRA

This morning we will drive towards Agra. Best known as the city of the world's most famous monument of love, Agra attracts thousands of tourists every day from all over the world. Upon arrival, check into the hotel.

This evening we will visit the Taj Mahal (closed on Friday), a seventh wonder of the world, to witness its shifting facades at sunset. The words Taj Mahal translates as Crown Palace. As we tour this amazing monument, we will hear the story of another great Mughal Emperor, Shah Jahan, who commissioned the "Taj" as a memorial to his wife, Mumtaz Mahal. With its magnificent setting on the banks of the River Yamuna, the Taj Mahal took 22 years to build and was completed in 1653. It has been called the most extravagant shrine ever built as a tribute to love.

Enjoy a shopping experience in the Mughal city and witness marble inlay work at a local workshop. Agra is known the world over for its famous inlay work. The best example is the Taj Mahal; the greatest monument of love.

DAY**4****AGRA - JAIPUR**

After breakfast we will explore elegant Agra Fort. Also known as the Red Fort, another work of Akbar the Great built over the course of eight years (1565-1573). The high red stone monument is notable for its smooth blending of Hindu and Asian ancestral architectural styles. The fort was successively occupied by Emperors Jahangir and Shah Jahan; the latter died here, imprisoned by his son and left to gaze at the Taj Mahal he had built.

A short visit to the Mother Teresa Home Missionaries of Charity will allow those interested to meet the nuns at the orphanage who devote their lives to the homeless children of India. Most of the orphans are girls who are more frequently abandoned at birth. The dire poverty of these unwanted children is heartbreaking, and this visit is therefore optional. No one at the missionary will ask you for a cash donation. It is not wanted. Rather, if you wish to contribute something of value, a simple set of sheets that you pack in your luggage would be greatly appreciated.

Continue we will drive towards Jaipur. En- route, we will stop at Fatehpur Sikri, the early abandoned capital of the Mughal Empire between 1570 and 1586. The great Mughal Emperor Akbar built this city to celebrate the birth of his son and future heir to the throne, Emperor Jahangir. While Akbar is believed to have been illiterate, he took great interest in the arts and architecture. Under his rule, Agra became a leading center of art, science, commerce and culture. Fatehpur Sikri is one of his masterworks. Sadly, it served as a capital for little more than a decade, and was eventually abandoned for lack of accessible water. Arrive at the "Pink City" of Jaipur. The origin of this nickname becomes immediately apparent as we enter the old city walls and greet the pink-colored buildings that rise at every turn.

DAY**5****JAIPUR**

Located a short distance outside of the city is Amber Fort and Palace. En-route we will stop to see the grand Hawa Mahal, the Palace of Winds. This magnificent five story structure was built with 953 windows to allow the royal ladies of the court to discretely watch the grand processions along the main street without being observed.

Perched on a hillside on the outskirts of town, Amber Fort and Palace was constructed in the 1590s by Maharaja Man Singh, the commander of Akbar's army, who chose the location for its highly defensible location. This is a beautiful and very well preserved structure, built on four levels and surrounded by ruins. It served as the backdrop for the Mira Nair movie "Kama Sutra: A Tale of Love." Upon arrival it is customary to ride the highly decorated caparisoned elephants up to the fort, Maharaja-style. However, the elephants are licensed and highly regulated, and it is possible at a moment's notice to be informed that the daily quota has been met. In that case, we will be transferred via jeep.

Continue to the City Palace Museum, which has a priceless collection of antiques, costumes and armory of the Mughals and Rajputs including swords of different shapes and sizes with chiseled handles. It also has an art gallery which displays a collection of miniature paintings, carpets, royal paraphernalia and rare astronomical works in Arabic, Persian, Latin and Sanskrit. We will visit the Jantar Mantar Observatory, a UNESCO World heritage site - a stone astrological and astronomical Observatory built by Maharaja Jai Singh in the 18th century.

Post lunch we will explore the bazaars of Jaipur during our Old Jaipur tour. The bazaars between the Badi (Large) and Chhoti (Small) Chaupar (Square) in the old city of Jaipur feature some of the best photo opportunities that the city has to offer. Your guide will lead you through the labyrinth of colorful alleys where artisans make puppets, bangles, and other local handicrafts.

DAY**6****JAIPUR – KHEJARLA**

This morning we will drive to a beautiful heritage fort resort constructed in 1611 A.D for Thakur Gopal Das Ji, who was granted 'Jagir' (fiefdoms) of Khejarla for his great feat in war. He bravely defended the frontiers of Marwar against the Mughals. Khejarla then was one of the most important Jagirs and Nobles enjoyed the highest status amongst the most trusted in the Court of Marwar.

The historic structure amalgamates with the golden tint of the desert ambience and the scenic setting suns in its most vibrant shades giving it a fairy tale appearance. Situated in a quiet and serene setting, Khejarla Fort carries a deep history and offers all the charisma and grandeur of an exclusive royal experience. This evening enjoy your royal dinner at the Resort.

DAY**7****KHEJARLA – JODHPUR**

This morning walk through the village to the 600 year old Temple of Goddess Durga (Goddess of War). History states that Aurangzeb, a Mughal from Delhi had tried to destroy it. The best time to visit this temple is during sunrise / sunset when you can climb up to the top and get a very good view of the landscape around.

Later drive to Jodhpur. On arrival we will check in to our hotel.

DAY**8****JODHPUR**

Jodhpur is an oasis in the arid Thar Desert and is also called the Blue city of India. Jodhpur touring begins with a visit to one of India's most imposing Forts - Mehrangarh Fort - is a living testimony of the military might of the Rajputs. With the strategically located cannons on the walls, the fort is spread over an area of 5 km at an altitude of about 125 meters. Thousands of tourists visit this fort every year to have a glimpse of the artillery system of the Rajput warriors. A bird's eye view of the city from above the fort is fascinating. Another example of Rajput glory is the Jaswant Thade, which a shrine is built in memory of Maharaja Jaswant II in 1899. A story goes that Maharaja Jaswant succumbed to injuries in this place while fighting the Mughal king Jahangir. Explore the Sardar Market's colorful bazaars and shop for textiles, handicrafts and clay figurines.

DAY**9****JODHPUR – UDAIPUR**

After breakfast; drive to Udaipur the famed "city of sunrise" also called the Venice of the East. En-route visit Ranakpur Jain Temple built in the 15th century are situated in the lovely valley of the Aravalli. Its surrounding is quiet and picturesque. Ranakpur has grand structures and beautiful sculpture. There are 1444 pillars in the temple and none of them are similar. The magic of light & shade is really awe inspiring. Upon arrival check in to the hotel, during the evening; stroll down to the colorful Rajasthani bazaar.

DAY

10

UDAIPUR

We begin our day at the City Palace, overlooking the blue waters of Lake Pichola. Maharana Udai Singh initiated construction in 1559 A.D., and it was subsequently expanded, with impressive uniformity, by several succeeding Maharanas. The palace consists of a number of beautiful courtyards and gardens. The main hall has been converted into a museum, housing opulent artifacts and original works of art. Inside the complex we will find the exquisite crystal gallery, exhibiting 19th century pieces including crystal chandeliers, tables, sofas and beds. We will continue walking towards the Jagdish Temple to study its many remarkable friezes. Lavishly built in 1651 by Maharana Jagat Singh, it is easy to understand why Jagdish is the most venerated Hindu temple in Udaipur.

In the early evening, we will take a sunset cruise on Lake Pichola, sailing past its picturesque ghats and palaces, stopping at the island of Jag Mandir, a 17th century water palace that witnessed two important historical events. It was the refuge for Prince Khurram, later known as Shah Jahan, when he was exiled by his father. Later, during the uprising of 1857, the island offered safety to several British families who fled from nearby Neemuch.

PAYMENT

The balance of the cost must be paid (and received in Indus Travels office) 45 days prior to the first day of the tour. If the final balance is not received on time, Indus Travels reserves the right to tear the booking as cancellation by you. If the booking is cancelled by you in this manner, your deposit shall be treated as a cancellation charge to cover Indus Travels' costs. If you book the tour within 45 days prior to the start of the tour, the full amount must be paid when the booking is confirmed.

CHANGES BY YOU
